High school students, in good academic standing and U.S. citizens, can also serve as election inspectors if they are at least 16 years of age. This is a paid position, paying \$11/hour. Shifts on election day are 6:30 am to 12:00 pm, 12:00 pm to 4:00 pm, and 4:00 to end.

# **Dog Licenses**

- Spayed/Neutered \$6
- Not Spayed/Neutered \$13

State statutes require that all dogs five (5) months of age or older need to be vaccinated against rabies and licensed each year. To obtain a license for your dog, please mail to the clerk, or bring in person:

- A <u>current copy of the dog's rabies certificate</u> (not a receipt from your vet showing that a vaccination was administered), and
- 2. A check or cash for the <u>payment</u> of the license. If paying by check, please write it separately from your tax payment.

Licenses issued after March 31<sup>st</sup> will include a \$10 late fee charge. ❖

# Where Do I Pay My Taxes?

To pay your **first installment** tax payments (due by Jan. 31, 2020):

- In person, at clerk's office during regular business hours.
- By mail. PO Box 88, Adell WI 53001. If you would like a receipt, you must enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope.
- At National Exchange Bank & Trust, Adell. If you would like a receipt, you must enclose a selfaddressed stamped envelope.

To pay your **second installment** tax payments (due July 31, 2020):

- By mail to the county treasurer's office. Address is printed on your tax bill. If you would like a receipt, you must enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope.
- In person, at the county treasurer's office.

Please do not send your second installment to the town clerk's office. Any 2nd installment payments will be returned to the sender.

#### **TAX OVER PAYMENT REFUNDS**

No refund is given, unless payment is over the full tax bill amount. Refunds will not be issued for amounts under \$5.00. \*\*



# Town of Sherman Welcomes JD Trucking

Greetings Town of Sherman residents! My name is Peter DeGroff and I am the owner of JD Trucking of Waldo, Inc.; a family-owned trash and recycling company.

Your town board and JDT have worked out an agreement for JDT to operate the drop-off site on Pelishek Road. Your board decided to look for alternate options because they were being faced with huge increases from Advanced Disposal, soon to be Waste Management.

Rather than going with the expense of stationary compactors and large dumpsters, we will position our garbage trucks and dumpsters for a single-file "drive-thru" type of operation. We will have one truck for recycling and one truck for trash. We will have larger dumpsters for bulky items and scrap metal, and we will also be accepting electronic waste.

I want to reassure you that any changes we make at your drop-off will be geared towards a more user-friendly service. By setting up a single-file traffic pattern, we want to eliminate the foot traffic created with dumpsters located distances apart from each other. By loading and removing all trash and recycling at the end of each work day, we will eliminate all odors, flies and rodents. And, by promoting more attendant involvement with assisting in the unloading of trash and recycling, older and handicapped individuals can remain in their vehicle.

I would like to invite you to use the Waldo Site. There you can get rid of your trash and recycling Wednesday through Friday 9:00 am to 4:00 pm, and Saturday 9:00 am to 1:00 pm yearround. We hope to keep your experience with us quick, safe and pleasant.

I would also like to invite you to consider curbside pick-up. Right now, JDT is picking up by some of your neighbors. Our curbside service is weekly, and the monthly fee includes household trash, recycling and bulky item pick-up. (Bulky items consist of large furniture, mattresses, etc., or items that do not fit in containers. Does not include construction materials.) Dumpsters are also available.

Change is sometimes difficult but I believe in the Vince Lombardi quote: "Keep it simple stupid".

Unfortunately, it will be necessary to set rates for everything that is brought in for drop-off because Waste Management will be dictating to me and every municipality, business and individual the price for disposal of trash and fees for handling recycling. Please see the rate schedule for details.

JDT believes in giving back to the community. By donating your aluminum cans at the drop-off on Pelishek Road, we will donate 25¢ per pound to community clubs, volunteer fire departments, and worthy charities. We look forward to your suggestions.
